Message from Pastor Kris

For me, the Christmas season is one of the most exciting, life- giving times of the year, and yet one of the most discouraging and frustrating. Growing up, the Christmas season was a reminder of the poverty and lack of money that existed within my family. Most of my early child- hood years, I lived with my single mother who worked many jobs to keep a roof over our heads and food on the table. She lived paycheck to paycheck, utilized food stamps to feed us and yet barely made it by each month. I could always sense the Christmas season was even more stressful and discouraging for my mother. It was a yearly reminder of how difficult life was, and how she was unable to buy me those high-cost, big purchases. I could tell that she wanted to so badly buy me those walkie-talkies, the Play Station game system, or those new clothes I always asked for. Instead, she gifted me simple gifts, often times the things we needed around the house. Or, I would receive over-sized or clearly worn clothes or toys that she was able to afford at a clothing bank or Salvation Army.

Now that I am an adult, I look back on Christmas and never remember the gifts. Nor can I remember all the gifts I wanted so badly. What I remember are those mornings that I would wake up, our apartment would look beautiful, my mom would remind me that she loved and cared for me so much, and she would tell me that being together was more important than any gift I would receive. After this initial excitement, I would head to our local UM church for a yearly Christmas Day service with my grandmother, Joyce. This was one of my favorite services each year. The pastor would remind us that the real meaning behind Christmas was the birth of Jesus. I can still picture my pastor dramatically reading the birth narrative from Luke 2. "Don't be afraid. Look! I bring good news to you – wonderful, joyous news for all people. Your savior is born today in David's city. He is Christ the Lord."

This worship service and just hearing the scripture read was my Christmas gift each year. Each year, I was reminded to not be afraid with my life. But to be joyful on this day because our Savior has been born, he is Christ the Lord. Jesus is born! Jesus is now among us! Christmas was that yearly reminder of the goodness of God, and how in the midst of life's difficulties Jesus is what matters.

If finances are an issue for you, if gift giving has lost its joy, if you can't find meaning in the midst of chaos, there is a solution. "Don't be afraid. LOOK! I bring good news to you – wonderful, joyous news for all people. Your savior is born today in David's city. He is Christ the Lord." Glory to God who has met me each year on Christmas, and provided me amazing peace. May God grant you peace and wholeness as you prepare for Christmas this year.



On October 20th, the Office of Community Services (OCS) Division of Energy Assistance (DEA) released 90% of the FY 2018 LIHEAP funds. Pennsylvania received the second largest funding allocation at \$178,633,729 of the approximately \$3.03 billion of Federal Fiscal Year 2018 regular block grant funding.

The Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program, also known as LIHEAP, helps lowincome families pay their heating bills. LIHEAP is a grant that offers assistance in the form of a cash grant, sent directly to the utility company, or a crisis grant for households in immediate danger of being without heat.
