Congregational Meeting

Twenty-three people attended the October 24 meeting held to provide facts, financial and otherwise, to make known the status of our church and its ministries. Led by Pastor Steven, information was presented and many of those present shared in discussion, question-asking, opinion-sharing, and visioning.

A number of members/families have decided to attend or transfer membership elsewhere. These relationships are missed as part of our family has left. Worship attendance averages about 25 weekly. Ten of that number are from two families.

Giving is down as well. Financially we are behind on some obligations including our apportionments and pastor's insurance. Apportionments can be put on hold, but the insurance is essential. Once again water entered the church basement but in a different location. A leak has sprung in the pastor's office ceiling. Recently repaired was the coupling about 50 feet down on the church well. Focusing on God, living out our faith can see us through this financial challenge.

Grants have been received to cover costs of enhancing sound/video to add quality to livestreaming and help with supplying food for our ministry to folks living at State Line Inn/Motel. The food ministry also counts on donations from members. The pantry is currently rather bare. (See a shopping list elsewhere in the newsletter.) How blessed we are to have food and housing!

Thoughts were shared re mask-wearing and inclusion of singing in worship. Singing will be gradually brought back into worship starting in November. Masks continue to be required from entry into the church until seated. Livestreaming of worship is an option for those who not to wear masks or are uncomfortable attending in person. Ultimately, worship is meant to be pleasing to God which sometimes means compromising without having each of our individual preferences accommodated.

Active participation is still vital despite the pandemic. Opportunities to help include serving as worship assistant, greeter, afterworship cleaning (takes about 10 minutes), once-a-month packing and delivery of food to the Inn, providing food for the ministry by placing it in marked totes, Advent planners, manpower to relocate the large sign now hard-to-see behind the new railing, and help of all kinds to prepare, package and deliver Nov. 21 meal to the Inn and shut-ins.

A number of important ideas came from group brainstorming and include these:

- *more positive attitudes are needed
- *purposeful fellowship such as working together on the Nov. 21 meal to strengthen relationships
- *adding an inspirational flyer monthly to food delivery to begin discipleship efforts to those served
- *delivery of Thanksgiving-type meal to Inn residents, our shut-ins and pick-up by others who want a meal
- *revitalize our ministries to children and youth
- *have volunteers ready (clearances and materials/lessons) ready for nursery and Sunday School
- *intentionally bridge the generation gap so all who worship feel included in our family

Some of the above ideas require us to get out of our comfort zones. Isn't that what we're called to do to bring Christ's love to others? We need to seek God's help through purposeful prayer and count on him to show us the way to reach others and build His kingdom.

The Leadership Team met Tuesday, October 20, 2020. The team welcomed Admin Assistant Mary Thomas to the meeting. She has assumed the treasurer's duty as Linda Junkins asked to step down after serving in this role for many years. Linda's faithful service has been greatly appreciated.

Also at the meeting:

- Approval given for T.O.P.S. (Take Off Pounds Sensibly) to meet at the church on Monday mornings for a donation of \$100 monthly
- Volunteers are needed in the following areas food delivery to the Inn once a month; food prep, packaging, and delivery of a
 Thanksgiving meal to the Inn/shut-ins on Nov. 21; worship assistants; Advent/Christmas planning THESE NEEDS ARE NOT
 MEANT TO BE MET BY LEADERSHIP TEAM ONLY
- Recent property issues include water in the basement again but in a different location; new coupler installed on well pump; leak from roof into pastor's office
- Large entrance sign near the ramp needs to be placed in front of the railing; COULD YOU HELP WITH THIS?
- A financial secretary is needed to count offering (with another person) and record giving to provide year-end reports to individuals; WOULD YOU BE WILLING TO SERVE IN THIS WAY?
- Online giving will be offered in the near future; stay tuned
- The PPP loan which covered salaries for several months will be forgiven meaning we will not be required to repay the loan amount
- A \$1000 sound system/technology grant was received, part to be used for livestreaming
